Our Commitment

We are dedicated to ensuring that effective systems and controls are in place to safeguard against modern slavery in all its forms. This commitment is reflected in our internal policies and procedures, including:

- **Recruitment Policy** – Ensuring all hiring practices are fair, transparent, and compliant with relevant legislation.
- **Whistleblowing Policy** – Empowering employees and contractors to report concerns safely and confidentially.

Supplier Due Diligence

We take a proactive approach to supplier relationships and expect the same high ethical standards from all our partners:

- We build long-standing relationships with our suppliers and clearly communicate our expectations regarding ethical conduct.
- We have **zero tolerance for slavery and human trafficking**.
- All suppliers are required to confirm their compliance with the **Modern Slavery Act 2015** before entering into any working relationship with CET.
- Where we engage non-UK based suppliers, we require them to have appropriate anti-slavery and human trafficking policies and processes in place.
- We conduct thorough due diligence on all major supply chain partners and ensure new contractors or suppliers confirm their compliance with the Act before we begin working together.
